Your information is being collected to use for the following purposes:

- To enable the school to provide information to Bedrock Learning in order to monitor progress and create appropriate individual strategies to improve literacy.
- Raising attainment at Peterhead Academy and other establishments in the north of Aberdeenshire has been a key focus for some time.
- In order to comply with GDPR requirements we will only supply Bedrock with forename, surname and class via their app. Bedrock Learning require additional information in order to track pupils effectively. We will supply Bedrock with further data via a spreadsheet with date of birth, SIMD, Gender, ASL. There will be no name on the spreadsheet, just a number that refers to the list supplied to their app.

The retention period for the data is:

User data will be deleted after an account has been inactive for 2 years (ie if a user has not logged in for that period). Any saved score data is deleted after 5 years on a rolling basis even if the account is still active only 5 years' worth of results will be held at any one time.
