This is brilliant, as we are very conscious that children are less active particularly outside. Now that they have a safe and inspiring area to play in, we need to keep this momentum going.

For the children to spend an extended period of play at the park, the opening of the public toilets would be a huge benefit. At the moment if they require to use a toilet, they have to return home, particularly if they live on the other side of the busy Main Street. This can often mean that this is the end of their park visit for the day.

The school often uses the park for PE – this year we had a block of running and fitness when we used the park for 6 weeks.
