Red Cross First Aid



In September Shared Lives was joined by Heather Roy from the Red Cross for a session in First Aid.

We learnt how to use whatever is at hand in an emergency to help either ourselves or someone else.

Here Garry is using his jumper to make a sling for an injured arm.

And Paul has used a tea towel to stop the bleeding on his hand. He has raised his hand above his head as this helps stop the bleeding too.



Gilian demonstrated how to do chest compressions if someone's heart has stopped. A good rhythm to administer chest compression to is 'baby shark'!

Rachel showed us all how to put someone in the recovery position if they are unconscious.



We had some other helpful advice from Heather:

- Dial 999 in an emergency. It is a good idea to have a note of our postcode near the phone as we will need this to tell the ambulance where to find you.
- If you are home alone say 'good morning' to the mirror. If you can't do this and normally can you need to get help.
- Heather recommended we pick up a 'Message in a Bottle' kit from our GPs.

The Message in a Bottle kit includes a form, where personal and medical information is detailed. This is placed in a distinctive bottle which is stored in the fridge. Two stickers are provided: one for the fridge door and the other for inside of the front door. Paramedics, police, fire-fighters and social services support this Lions life-saving initiative and know to look in the fridge when they see the Message in a Bottle stickers, supplied.

This session was a great chance to learn ways to look after our own health and wellbeing and also that of others.

Aden for October

At Aden in October we visited the Aberdeenshire Farming Museum which was a great opportunity to learn about our heritage.

Here Fiona and Paul are with a plough which was used in the mid to late 19th century (1800s).



We were interested to learn about 'The Book of Deer' which used to be kept at Old Deer in the 10th century (900BC).



We shared lunch and then met with Aberdeenshire Ranger Sarah Gosden for an afternoon of orienteering. Whilst following our route on the map Sarah made us aware of our surrounding and helped us appreciate our lovely countryside.

For example, did you know that Yew Trees used to be used to make long bows as their wood is flexible. Although their berries are poisonous.

Also, mice are very tidy eaters. They eat cones like corn on the cob and eat every last piece. Red squirrels tear at the cones and make a real mess.

This huge tree Fiona is standing next to is a Beech tree.

The Parkmore Activity Weekend began with carving of pumpkins.



Here are the recipes of the three winners:

Andrew’s Flapjacks



9 oz oats
5 oz sugar
6 oz margarine

Preheat the oven to 180C
Melt butter in a pan, mix in the oats and sugar. Mix well.

Pour onto a baking tray and press down.
Bake in the oven for 10-15 minutes or until golden brown.

George’s Fruit Salad

Strawberries
Tin of pineapple
Bananas
Plums
Maple syrup
Lime



Wash the strawberries and plums. And chop to bitesize pieces.

Put in a bowl with the pineapples.
Add chopped bananas.
Zest the lime into a small bowl. Add some maple syrup and stir.
Add the dressing to the fruit and mix well.

Maggie's Cheesecake

14 Digestives/Chocolate – crushed
60g Melted Butter
30g Caster Sugar + 1 level spoon Cinnamon
225g Philadelphia
142ml Double Cream
150g Bar Chocolate



Stir melted butter into crushed biscuits
Line tin with it and put in fridge
Stir sugar into Philadelphia cheese
Lightly whip cream and fold into cheese mix
Stir in melted chocolate
Spread over biscuit base
Refrigerate overnight.
