Our mission is to improve the quality of life and realise the potential of Scotland's people and communities — inspired by the example of our founders, the Robertson Sisters. In particular, we focus on the health, social and educational inequalities prevalent in Scotland.

The Robertson Trust was established in 1961 by the Robertson sisters Elspeth, Agnes and Ethel, who donated their shares in the family businesses, built up by their grandfather and father, to the Trust for charitable purposes.

The sisters were among the first Trustees, serving for a combined total of 71 years and ensuring the Trust upheld the principles at the heart of the family: honesty, integrity and a willingness to help people in need.

The family business now operates as the global company Edrington — one of Scotland's largest private companies and owner of several well-known whisky brands. The sisters' generosity enables the Trust to use the dividends from its controlling shareholding in Edrington for the benefit of Scotland's people and communities.

VATTENFALL

Vattenfall have committed to annually investing £150,000 to a community benefit scheme for the 20 year lifetime of the European Offshore Wind Deployment Centre, in Aberdeen Bay.

We are delighted to share with you that applications for Vattenfall's Unlock our Future Fund will open on 14th January 2019 and close on 15th April 2019. Application forms will **be available from 14th January at The Unlock our Future Fund webpage** (<https://www.foundationscotland.org.uk/programmes/unlock-our-future-fund>) which will go live on that date. It is expected that the **successful applicants** will receive their funding award in early Summer 2019.

Following an extensive community consultation the fund priorities were decided and the boundaries of the Fund established. Any constituted organisation or community group in Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire is eligible to apply.

The feedback from community members across the City and Shire was that this should be a different fund that should make a real difference to communities across the region. There are four key priorities of the scheme and each application must demonstrate how it will meet **all four** of these priorities outlined below. To be eligible for funding from the *Unlock our Future Fund*, each application must:

- Contribute to a climate smarter world with sustainability at its core
- Invest in community facilities and/or activities that are fit for the future
- Be innovative
- Ensure a legacy and lasting impact which clearly brings benefit to the local community.

In Summer 2018, an independent community champions panel was appointed to shape the fund, the strategy, the application process and to select the successful applications. This panel appointed Foundation Scotland as the administrator of the fund.

Following the launch on Monday 14th January 2019 there will be a series of drop in sessions, open to all, for application support. At these sessions you will meet some of the community champions panel, Foundation Scotland representatives and some other key organisations and funders who may be able to support groups with their applications.
