My eldest , is now part of the Senior club.

Having travelled all over Scotland playing and, in the past, coaching rugby, the Mackie youth / mini sections are the second biggest club in region and Scotland. What they have lacked is facilities to match the enthusiasm that the youth provides. The Senior club have struggled to retain players, who often go off to University and are immersed in clubs with much better facilities than they have previously been afforded. There is also the lease factor of Redcloak and recent withdrawl of the lease from the landowner of the lower pitch only exacerbates this dilemma.

Hopefully those that attend from Stonehaven would walk to the weekend matches. At least it will only be for a few hours at the weekend when the matches are on. Keeping the club in the town insures that those without transportation can join in. The importance of which can not be overstated.

I don't see lighting as a problem as it would only be used during training which would surely be finished by 9pm.

As to the loss of a playing field for the schools I can't see why the rugby club would not allow classes to use it for activities. I know they already have a great relationship with all the local schools.

For those that use the park for running and dog walking, it should be easy enough to continue to run or walk around the pitches on paths that will surely be put there.

The play park looks to remain for our young children while the older ones can surely make their way to Mineral Well, Farochie Park, or Dunnottar. All within a 10 minute or less bike ride.

I do know how people feel about the loss of green space and I am usually the first to agree but not this time. Several years ago the field behind where I live had a care home built on it. 

Asset Transfer Request - Mackie RFC for the Land of Forest Park

I write in support of the asset transfer request made by Mackie Rugby Football Club relating to the land at Forest Park, Stonehaven.

The proposed use of the land is to construct two rugby pitches to SRU competition standard, training area, clubhouse, changing rooms, storage and fitness suite. The proposal will also include the car park but exclude the 'Hamish' play park.

Mackie RFC has already lost one of their pitches at Redcloak, and the incumbent landowner will not be renewing the current lease for the site which accommodates the remaining pitch, training area, clubhouse, changing rooms and fitness suite. The club has sought for many years a suitable, affordable site in which to develop the club for the benefit of its members and wider community. Land at Rickarton, Redcloak and Cemetery Hill have been ruled out for a number of reasons including: requiring extensive costly groundworks in relation to a short lease, no direct access or simply outbid by a competitor.

The Benefits of Rugby as an Organised Sport

I have 3 sons ranging in age from 10-15 whom have all played rugby at Mackie RFC since P2. The benefits of their participation in rugby are many:

- Personal development they have matured into self-disciplined boys with a keen sense of teamwork, respect for others and an appreciation of sportsmanship
- The coaching team serve as positive role models and in turn my boys have naturally developed peer mentoring skills
- The club environment has offered a safe space for youth in which to promote healthy habits of exercise, mental health support, and drug awareness whilst allowing them to engage the 'safe risks' the sport of rugby offers.
- The wide catchment of the club also provided the best means of transition from Dunnottar School to Mackie Academy for my older two sons
- My eldest son recently gained an 'A' in his National 5 PE exam, using his rugby performance for the practical element of the assessment. He intends to continue with Higher PE next year, again with rugby as his main focus. Other club members have used rugby as part of their DoE Award.
- My eldest son has also been able to gain invaluable work experience through acting as a volunteer coach during rugby camps.
- Recent participation in the Boy's National Club Conference (the top league in youth club rugby) has developed their resilience and self-reliance through group coach travel to their matches.

• Their club involvement will benefit them in their university applications and will also assist in a smooth transition from school into university.

The Benefits of Proper Rugby Facilities

Deeside RFC, Garioch RFC and Ellon RFC all enjoy the advantages of secure tenancy, clubhouses and well-maintained pitch facilities. Despite Mackie RFC's uncertain long-term position, the youth section in particular has performed well over the past few seasons. There are several benefits for Mackie RFC in developing a permanent rugby facility with amenities on site including:

- A clubhouse offering a means of delivering coaching in a classroom setting
- A secure location for storing equipment, accessible to the whole coaching team
- A purpose-built fitness suite to help with player strength and conditioning
- Changing rooms and accessible toilet facilities for both players and visitors
- Kitchen facilities to allow the club to host visiting teams. This is particularly important now that the U13s-U18s are playing in the Boy's National Club Conference, which, as the top league in youth club rugby involves playing teams from across Scotland. This year the competition includes: Perthshire RFC, Stirling County RFC, Boroughmuir RFC (Edinburgh), Highland RFC (Inverness), GHA RFC (Glasgow) and Ayr-Wellington RFC.
- Secure pitches laid to SRU competition standard, which are level, well-drained, free
 of rabbit burrowing and in particular, dog fouling. The following extracts from
 councils across the UK highlight the problem of dog walking on sports fields and
 children's play areas:

"Dog fouling is a major concern to many people, not just because of the mess it causes, but because it can be a health risk. Dogs may deposit roundworm eggs (Toxocara canis) in their faeces, which become infectious after about three weeks, and can remain so for up to two years.

Anyone, but particularly children playing near to the ground, can run the risk of picking up and swallowing the eggs. The eggs then hatch in the intestine, burrow through the intestine wall into the blood stream and pass into the body.

Possible symptoms of toxocaral infection range from aches, dizziness and nausea to asthma and pneumonia, but as these symptoms can all be caused by other things, infections often go undiagnosed. In the UK there are around 100 cases of toxocariasis diagnosed each year.

In rare cases eye disease and loss of vision can be caused when the toxocara larva passes through the eye."

"Dog faeces can pose a significant health risk to humans, particularly young children as their immune systems are not fully developed. Children are also more likely to come into contact with soil or sand that contains dog faeces whilst playing in parks, gardens and playgrounds. All faeces contain bacteria that can cause stomach upsets, but the greatest risk is from toxocariasis.

Toxocariasis is particularly hazardous to small children as it can result in blindness.

Toxocara is the name given to a species of roundworm commonly found in dogs and cats. Virtually all puppies are born with Toxocara. Puppies and kittens can also be infected with Toxocara through their mother's milk or from environmental contamination. The type of toxocara found in dogs can endanger human health. The type of toxocara found in cats has only rarely been associated with cases of Toxocariasis (Toxocara infection).

Microscopic toxocara eggs are present in the faeces of infected animals. These eggs have thick, sticky shells which means that they can remain infective in the soil for two to four years after the faeces have disappeared. The sticky shell helps eggs to adhere to fingers or clothing.

Random soil sampling shows that the majority of the parks in the UK are contaminated with Toxocara eggs in various stages of development. Many infected soil samples are found in the vicinity of children's play areas, even though dogs are often banned from these areas.

Toxocara eggs are not infectious until they embryonate. This is usually at least 2 – 3 weeks after they have been deposited by a dog. A single dog mess can contain approximately 1 million microscopic eggs.

The Benefits of the Forest Park Location

Whilst Mackie RFC currently delivers some of its sessions at Mackie Academy, the school site is likely to undergo considerable development over the next several years with a relocation of Dunnottar School and Nursery (in separate buildings) and the possibility of Carronhill School being co-located in a shared campus.

The Forest Park site has a number of benefits:

- Services are already in place/minimal connection distance electricity, water and sewerage
- Existing road access and car parking areas
- Accessible by walking, bike and public transport
- Well-lit and within 30mph limit which is safer than current Redcloak location for youth attending training sessions
- Prior use as a pitch by Mackie RFC with floodlights installed
- Already designated a 'sports area', rather than 'public park', 'play space' or 'schools/institution' in Aberdeenshire Council's Open Space Audit (updated in 2019) www.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/media/16736/stonehaven.pdf

What Does Mackie RFC Offer?

For Mackie RFC members:

- The club offers a wide range of rugby from nursery-U18, seniors, mammoths, ladies and touch. The club are striving to widen their offer to include disability rugby too.
- Mackie's 'Rugby Academy' offers a youth development programme (U15-U18)
 offering 3 mid-week training sessions, Saturday training and Sunday matches. The
 aim is to develop each player to reach their potential and includes fitness, speed and
 agility, strength conditioning, lifestyle, mindfulness and nutrition guidance in
 addition to rugby skills.
- Nurturing U18 talent currently 10 players are progressing to the next attending Caledonia training camp.
- U13-U18 are currently competing in the 2021-22 Boy's National Club Conference (the top league in youth club rugby). Mackie are currently sitting in 4th out of 10 teams and will be competing against Boroughmuir RFC, Stirling County RFC, Ayr-

Wellington RFC, GHA RFC (Glasgow Hutchesons'-Aloysians RFC), Perthshire RFC and Highland RFC.

- Mackie RFC, through its Development Officer, offers primary schools specialist rugby taster sessions to enrich primary school PE lessons. These outreach sessions cover the catchment of Mackie, Mearns and Portlethen Academies and in 2021-22 the following schools will have received a term block of rugby:
- Term 1: Fishermoss PS, Auchenblae PS, Bervie PS, Hillside PS
- Term 2: Portlethen PS, Laurencekirk PS, Catterline PS, Kinneff PS, Arduthie PS
- Term 3: Dunnottar S, Mill o' Forest PS, Newtonhill PS, Glenbervie PS, Fettercairn PS
- Local community assistance where required, the club have provided help and support for:

Mitigation Against Potential Concerns & Impacts

There are a number ways in which the proposal has addressed potential local concerns to the asset transfer:

- Hamish's playpark will be retained as a safe play area and is not included in the proposal.
- A walking path will be installed around the pitches and there is a large area suitable for dog walking between Riverside Drive and the Carron Water.
- Well-designed and installed modern floodlighting will minimise light spillage. Lower levels of lighting are required for training compared to levels required for competition games. Due to the distances travelled by visiting clubs, games take place during daylight hours at weekends.
- Public transport, walking and biking will be encouraged as a way of reducing traffic
 and potential parking issues. Forest Park is a safer, more accessible destination for
 youth players to walk and bike compared to Redcloak. Visiting youth teams from the
 National Club Conference will travel to games by coach and there is the potential for
 overspill parking in the Forest View Centre.
- The club are happy to work with the community and assist other clubs and group without facilities or land e.g. athletics club.
- In terms of noise concerns, the proposed area was previously used as a rugby pitch by the senior team.
- Community Engagement As the first step in Community Engagement, an initial presentation about the asset transfer request was delivered at Stonehaven & District Community Council's April 2021 meeting



As a local resident of Stonehaven, who grew up in Provost Stewart Place, no more than a few hundred yards from the park, and attended the brand new Mill O' Forest school as a part of the first primary one intake, I would like to offer my **support** to Mackie RFC in their bid to purchase and re-home to the site on Forest Drive.

I will declare an interest as I am a local business owner who has provided architectural support to the club over the years, and to many local community groups, including the provision of the 3G Pitches at Mineral Well. I also have 2 brothers who were members of the club and started their playing careers with the club. Both of which now play touch Rugby at an International level having recently competed in Portugal for the Scotland Men's over 45s. My brother in law is an active supporter of the club and committee member and one of my nephews has progressed through from the youth team to the current senior side.

The rugby club in Stonehaven was established during 1976 – just senior rugby at the time. During the teachers strikes in the early 1980's it was found that rugby – while previously played at Mackie Academy under the guidance of a Mr Roxborough during term time, became one of the casualties of the 'work to rule' policy adopted in schools. The school no longer offered rugby. This was a blow to the young rugby club as it effectively cut off the source of new blood into the game, putting the future of the club at great risk. Club president of the day Doug Bruce persuaded a local man and rugby supporter: Graeme Thomson to start a club driven junior or mini section. There is a bench in his memory outside the Marine Hotel in Stonehaven. This was 1986 and started with 5 children. 35 years later we have had thousands of children benefiting from the coaching, hopefully helping them become better people. At this time, Mackie rugby have around 400 kids under 18 playing and developing as individuals every year. The club is established now as the largest youth rugby club in the North East, and one of the largest in the whole country.

The rugby club do support the community, but largely just get on with the job quietly, without seeking any recognition or real support for what they do. This is a huge asset for the town, in my opinion. The benefits to both health and wellbeing brought about from sport and especially team sport, are widely recognised.

The clubs current home has been taken from them, this is not planned or desired, they have no choice due to their lease coming to an end and the owner selling the asset, and the other pitch at Redcloak which is also leased has been given notice and the lease runs out soon with no chance of it being renewed. The club have known this for some time and have been actively seeking a new site for more than 15 years. There are several reasons for not finding a site is the general location of the town with the hilly topography, and several bids by local developers and land owners, which were dependent on succeed in creating new housing or supermarket. The Club have had many offers of support, but all subject to caveats of succeeding with a development that was not in the Local Development Plan.

The Club also attempted to purchase land when it came up for sale – beside the cemetery. While they were aware of the need for an extension, they felt there was enough room there to do that and also create a couple of pitches. The Club was out-bid and the land was we believe sold to Aberdeenshire Council.

I would like to draw your attention to the Settlement Survey: Stonehaven

Overall, Stonehaven has about 40 per cent of its area available as public open space, due in large part to the presence of Dunnottar Woodland Park, Mineralwell Park and extensive playing fields at Mackie Academy. Amongst the larger towns of Aberdeenshire, Stonehaven stands out as having a well balanced range of open space types available to residents: woodland, coast, parks, field sports, tennis facilities, play areas and civic space. It is clear the rugby club need support in finding a suitable site within the town surroundings, and they should be applauded for the work they do and the foresight to try and secure their future. If there are any other available and suitable pieces of land available I am sure they would be delighted to hear but to date there seems to be nothing forthcoming within the time schedule.

The park on Forest Drive is probably the most underused facility in the town, this has been evidenced by surveys carried out in the assessment phase of potential sites to be considered for the facility. Very rarely do you see anyone there apart from the occasional jogger or dog walker. As a resident of Stonehaven, I regularly walk past this area and even as a child who did play on the triple swing at the top of the park prior to the invention of play-station, this park has never been well used. Nearby there is the Hamish play park, which is to be retained and is well used by the local residents and community. We rarely noticed anyone using the park area. Indeed my own lasting memories of the greatest utilisation of this area is the fact that the Rugby Club used it as a training pitch and had lighting for this purpose, which I know the club have evidenced to the local authority.

I have really felt compelled to submit this representation of support is in part due to the campaign against the proposal. Only today I saw a post encouraging attendance at the park as reporters

had been asked to attend (for a staged event), in the post the group is openly seeking attendees to show the park in use, if this is not an admission and acceptance of non-use by the very group campaigning against the proposal, I don't know what is. Lets use our green space to the best that we can, this will guarantee it is a green space for sport going forward and the club presence will in essence provide additional community based facilities for the greater benefit of the wider community.

As a local resident who grew up in Provost Stewart Place and attended the brand new Mill O' Forest school when it opened I would like to offer my support to Mackie RFC in their bid to purchase and re-home to the site on Forest Drive. The club needs a home and it is vital to the future of the rugby club and to all of those players, young and old, who benefit immensely (both physically and mentally) from the coaching, support and general positive and welcoming environment that the club provides.

Although no longer an active member of Mackie Rugby Club I benefited by playing for the club from 1987 to 2003. When I moved abroad in 2003 rugby was the thing that integrated me into the communities I joined in both Singapore and the Netherlands and when I returned to Stonehaven 14 years later I came back playing touch rugby. I now represent Scotland at touch rugby in the mens over 45's category and my love of the sport dates back to my time playing rugby with Mackie all those years ago.

This land is currently designated within the local plan as an area for recreational open space and further highlighted in Aberdeenshire Council's Settlement Summary as a "Sport Area"

https://www.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/media/14714/settlement-summary-kincardine-and-mearns.pdf Unfortunately, due to the poor drainage and open access to dog walkers, this land is not currently suitable for its designated use. I therefore support Mackie RFC's proposal to reinvigorate this area in line with its designated use through the creation of two competition pitches and a community rugby sports facility consisting of, club house, changing rooms, fitness suite, storage facilities and carpark. I believe that this will be a huge asset for the whole of Stonehaven and will increase the opportunity for sport on this land significantly. This location brings the additional benefit of being easily accessible within the town boundary allowing players and visitors to easily access the facility by walking, bike or public transport.

Mackie RFC offer a significant role in the local community and the wider Kincardine and Mearns area. Firstly, unlike many other sports, Mackie RFC welcome men, ladies, boys and girls of any ability to take part in club activities. Their philosophy is on developing the person, not just the player. Being able to play rugby is not a prerequisite to join in fitness and fun activities through the club. The club's offerings range through pre-school, micro, mini, youth, senior and mammoth age groups. Of particular note is the club's commitment to offering an outstanding package of training through its Rugby Academy. This provides personal development in a safe space for the most susceptible age group in our community. Suitable facilities are essential for this work to continue, and land ownership is crucial in providing access to the numerous funding options the club have explored. The Rugby Academy winter training currently takes place under temporary lighting on the leased land at Redcloak – Forest Park is not currently used for this due to the aforementioned drainage issues, and dog fouling.

I currently coach mini rugby to 14 children within the P4 age group at the club - should this proposal not be accepted, their playing and personal development will be hugely affected as they progress to youth rugby. Furthermore, I have 3 children of my own who have all benefitted immeasurably from the current facilities at Redcloak - not just as players, but as individuals: health, fitness, teamwork and respect have been ingrained throughout their involvement with the

As well as the rugby focused activities, Mackie RFC contribute to the local community in many ways; sharing current resources across multiple organisations, willing free labour supply from festivals to floods, fund raising, food bank shops and school sport sessions. This is all funded predominantly from the club's own pocket.

Finally, I believe that the proposal put forward by the club mitigates the impact on local residents, notwithstanding the current designated usage of this area:

- Normal training is out with regular school times limiting any increase in current traffic levels.
- The car park is retained, with adequate car parking along Forest Drive and overflow parking available at Forest View
- A perimeter path is retained for dog walking
- Mini Hampden / Dunnottar Woodland Park both remain available locally for residents
- Modern floodlight design gives less light pollution than the existing floodlights
- Toilet and changing facilities are included in the proposal
- · Schools and local clubs will be welcomed to share the facilities
- Critically, the "play park" is not affected by this proposal

The proposal for Scottish Rugby Union competition approved facilities should make the whole community proud, as well as facilitating the current success of the club against the top teams in the country. 
The commitment from players, staff and the SRU is dedicated. The current grounds are used almost every day for skills training, fitness, and of course games.



Ref: Mackie Rugby Football Club / Mill of Forest.

Mackie Rugby club is an all inclusive rugby club providing sporting, social and physical health services to the town and surrounding areas. Established nearly 50 years ago by a group of Mackie Academy Pupils the club has cemented itself within the town of Stonehaven. The club provides the game of rugby to all ages and abilities. The club currently offers rugby from P2 right up to our senior section the Mammoths. This means we are providing rugby from ages 5 right through to our current oldest player who is 62 years old. Our current 1st XV play regularly in the Caledonian league against local opposition and regularly travel to Ross Sutherland, Caithness and Inverness to play Highland. Our Youth section currently play in the Lancer Shogun League having won our local section 4 years out of 5, they are now playing in the highest group country wide playing teams as far away as Ayr, Glasgow, Stirling and Perth. Our mini's section is one of the strongest in Scotland with great numbers at all age groups. The mammoths play regularly agains veterans opposition such as Brechin, Elgin Panmure and Ellon.

The club has a very strong presence in the community regularly supporting the fee'in market, the harbour festival and work in tandem with the Lions Club. Last year during lock-down the club donated to local food banks. The club has recently changed to a charity allowing it access and back up from all the major sporting bodies in regards to this proposed asset transfer.

Currently, the club is houses on pitches at Redcloak, on the slug road. The club has been homed at Redcloak since its inception on leased land. Historically the club had two pitches at Redcloak, know as the 1st and 2nd's pitches. Around 5 years ago the lease ran out on the 2nd's pitch and the club removed the rugby posts and the land was returned to its owner. The current lease on the 1st pitch is due to lapse within the next 4 years or so, as the owners now want the land for other use, the club will find itself homeless.

The club has spent many years looking to secure land to call home. Land within Stonehaven and the surrounding area is very difficult to secure, especially to purchase and own. The club has bid on land within the area of Stonehaven but have been unsuccessful. The club tried to secure land behind the graveyard in Stonehaven, land that would have been ideal but were out bid by the council. This land currently sits un used.

The club has a history with Mill o Forest having used the park for years as a training venue and for playing the occasional games. Only within the last 6-8 years ago where the rugby posts were removed. The club was also instrumental in installing the floodlights at Mill o Forest. This green space (that's very rarely used) would be the ideal location for the rugby club. It would allow a safe and secure area for the club to continue the great work providing sporting facilities for the club. The area would allow the club to have 2 full sized pitches alongside a club house and gym facilities. It would also allow a suitable amount of parking within the plans.

Stonehaven as a town has a large percentage of green space available compared to local towns such as Inverurie, Ellon etc. Having large amounts of green space being used by the other sports in Stonehaven such as football and cricket it is only fair that the planned change of ownership of Mill o Forest to Mackie Rugby Club is approved by the council.

Over many years the club has provided a safe and secure area for the youth of Stonehaven to pursue sporting endeavours. As a community, sporting pursuits should be encouraged to all age groups and abilities, the benefits of rugby not only keeps you physically fit but provides fun, friendship and fraternity, all which help tackle the problems with mental health, a topic that is high on everyones agenda. Moving to Mill o Forest will allow the club to have ownership of land that will allow this good work it has done for the community to continue.

On a personal note, my family is heavily involved within the club and have made many friends over the years since moving to the area around 20 years ago. The health benefits of being involved within the club benefited my family greatly. My eldest son is currently the vice captain of the 1st XV having progressed through the club since the age of 6. Being involved within the club has been incredibly beneficial to him, allowing him to develop social skills and make friends that will see him through for years to come, My youngest

currently stars for the U15's and I currently coach our senior section. My wife currently helps with the social side of the senior section.





I am writing to advise that I fully support the application of the Community Asset transfer of the Park on Forest Road, Stonehaven to the Mackie Rugby Club.

I do not know a considerable amount about rugby and have no allegiance or connections with the Club.

I do understand the benefits of sport on both physical and mental wellbeing and believe that the transfer of the park to the Rugby Club would be beneficial to a larger amount of the community than the park is currently utilised by. From the local newspaper, school news and social media it is obvious that the teams are playing competitively against clubs who are much better served in terms of facilities. Despite having poor facilities the Club continues to be successful.

The Club has an active profile and is active in the Community. Having a permanent home would allow them to develop their ground and players at both participation and performance levels of rugby. I regularly walk past Mackie Academy when training is on for the Mackie Minis, this includes boys and girls being encouraged in teamwork, collaboration and of course physical exercise. Without a permanent home a club cannot future plan, apply for funds, train officials or enter competition with the insecurity of having no ground to play on. However the green field is not well utilised other than a dog exercise area. I walk past the park regularly with my dogs and on the whole it is not a well utilised public space. I am writing to express my full support for the relocation of Mackie Rugby Club to the forest Park area in Stonehaven.

Although I see the irony in getting rid of an existing public space to utilise for the rugby club, having lived in Stonehaven for 12 years I can honestly say I have not seen the park being used much aside from dog walkers (of which I am one, and do use that space) and touch rugby in evenings (which is also Mackie Rugby Club).

The park is used most often as a shortcut to get between the Mill o Forest school and Nursery, to the Hamish playpark. Poor drainage has meant that the grass is often saturated and therefore not ideal for any other activities. From experience as my son attended mill o Forest school, the school sports days are held on the grass at the school, not in this park. The primary schools Cross country club run across the park but then around it for distance and this would not be precluded.

In my experience of living nearby and passing the park regularly I can say confidently that using the majority of it for the rugby club will make little difference to residents and their current usage.

As most people agree, it would be fantastic to have a purpose built rugby facility which didn't use an existing park, but as that seems to have been ruled out then this is the best compromise in my opinion. The benefit that the rugby club to the community as a whole, and not just to the 100's of youngsters who are members is huge. Stonehaven has a well established football team for all ages, as well as tennis, basketball, and cricket. These sports clubs all have dedicated space allocated to them, and in the case of football there are multiple pitches that can be used. The rugby club are limited to only being able to use Mackie academy school grounds, or the current rugby pitch at Redcloak. As both of these options are now at high risk of being removed it is important that the council fight on behalf of the club to keep it going. An additional benefit of having the pitches and clubhouse is the opportunity for other organisations to make use of the space too. Stonehaven is lacking in council owned indoor facilities for sports and fitness activities so another option is a great thing for the town.

Losing a social asset as good as this for want of a home would be real detriment to the town.

Over many years the club has put in a tremendous effort to try and secure land for a permanent base which would be an enabling factor in securing grants and the further development of the club. Despite these efforts, the club has been thwarted on many occasions and now faces a very real prospect of being homeless. The land at Forest Park probably represents the last opportunity available to the club to secure land in the area. Forest Park also represents a location that will enable the club to integrate with the community more fully, providing much needed function facilities that will be shared with the whole community.

I understand that residents may feel some loss of amenity, but the development of tis space is this way will be positive addition to the whole town including the local residents

For each of them, and us as a family, the rugby club has been a source of fun, friendship and community. My involvement with rugby clubs since I was a teenager has taught me that it is a sport where the whole family can feel welcome and included. My husband has made life long friends through Mackie RFC and my son will no doubt do the same. We live outside of Stonehaven and my son went to a fairly small country school yet the friendships he made through his involvement in the rugby club meant he joined Mackie Academy with the reassurance that he had friends there already who provided a **support network**. Good afternoon,

I'm writing to voice my support for the relocation of Mackie Rugby Club to the Forest Park area within Stonehaven.

Our son plays for the Mackie U14 team, and has benefitted from the support of the club since 2014, when he was 6 years old. When he found it difficult to settle in to a new life in a new town with new people around him, the rugby club provided a safe and fun community where our son was encouraged to be part of a team with good values. This has worked wonders for him over the years, and even now, some seven years on, the club is providing vital coaching and support to a teenager that struggles to accept it elsewhere.

Mackie Rugby Club is a very community focused organisation, and our son has really benefitted from the support and friendships made through the club. He is certainly not alone in this regard. The club is very well run despite the lack of resources, and is achieving a huge amount. Our son's team is competing with those at the very top level in Scotland; clubs with permanent homes, expensive clubhouses and training facilities... and little old Mackie RFC are up there with them.

While there is a level of community reluctance for the club to relocate to Forest Park, I hope that agreement can be reached for this to happen. The location is far safer for children and teenagers to travel to than other possibilities (including the current location, which involves them walking or cycling on a main road without full pathways). A permanent home for Mackie RFC in the heart of Stonehaven, and close to the train station would be a real benefit to a club that has a solid foundation and a very strong membership.

Sadly, from my time in Stonehaven, Forest Park is vastly underused. It's not even suitable for walking the dog for 8 months a year due to a lack of sufficient drainage. There most certainly is not regular use for picnics and kite flying - let alone regular sports; as some of the leaflets and social media posts would suggest. There seems to be resistance for resistance sake, rather than the park being utilised. Some of the arguments against just seem to be more focused on avoiding change, rather than considering that it may be a positive thing.

My fear is that the closed-minded resistance to change may lead to the rugby club not being relocated to Forest Park, and then the park just continues to be a dead space 99% of the time, as it currently is. With the exhaustive work that the Mackie Rugby Club have put in to try to find a permanent home, if this application is rejected, then I fear for the impact on a club that provides a massive benefit to the community. Relocating far outside the Stonehaven area, or simply ceasing to be would be unthinkable when there is a simple and very positive solution presented.

In my opinion, rejecting the proposal under largely inaccurate claims of the level of community use of the park would be a terrible mistake, when Mackie RFC would bring a very positive use of the area to the community.



I refer to the above request for asset transfer to Mackie RFC at Forest Park Stonehaven, in lieu of the pending termination of the lease of their current facilities at Redcloak.

Having been a former player at the club in the late 1980s/early 1990s and subsequently a coach, later senior coach, with their Minis Section from 1995 to 2007; I would like to remind the council of the legacy that Mackie Rugby club has given to the youth of Stonehaven and the surrounding areas. In this case I would like to emphasise on the work done with the primary school children through Mackie Minis

Over the years the Minis section has grown from a handful of enthusiastic children to hundreds in any given week, making the Minis Section and also the Youth Section one of the most successful for Scottish Rugby. In the period when I worked with the boys and girls, we enthusiastically encouraged many skills including teamwork and respect - something which continues to this day

Now retired from the local rugby scene I can reflect on the successes that the Rugby Club have brought to sport and representation within the local community and further afield (the catchment area for the club ranges from as far north as Portlethen and south to Laurencekirk and Inverbervie).

The success of the club for a place like Stonehaven has been enormous. Regularly invitations for the boys and girls from Stonehaven to play throughout Scotland have become a regular event, including recently at Glasgow Rugby's facility at Scotstoun. Several players (both boys and girls) have gone on to represent Scotland at age range rugby from under 16 to under 21 level; some have later played for other clubs at Murrayfield in the national club finals; whilst others have gone on to play and coach rugby throughout the world.

However, it is the legacy to the ordinary families in Stonehaven and the surrounding area that has been the most prevalent for the Minis Section of the rugby club. The activities have brought together thousands of boys and girls over the years - many of whom are now grown up with families of their own, with the club offering their on-going ethos of fun filled activity and mini rugby. Fourteen years later I am still regularly stopped by both parents and former children (now adults) who enthuse over their time associated with Mackie Minis.

My concern is that if there is nowhere for Mackie Rugby Club to set down roots within Stonehaven when the lease is terminated at Redcloak, then there is a danger that Mackie Rugby Club will ultimately cease to exist. Resultantly any legacy and benefit which has been given to all these boys and girls within the community will be lost - particularly in an era when the encouragement of sport is advocated with both local and national initiatives

There have been a lot of relatively one sided comments in the local press over this request for an asset asset transfer of Forest Park to Mackie Rugby Club. In each case the good work of the rugby club is never doubted; however the reality that it could all come to and end is not taken into account. I therefore request that the council consider granting the application of the asset transfer and allow the good work of Mackie Rugby Club within the community to continue

I have played rugby for 20 years now and travelled to many different clubs around the country where similar developments are found in close proximity to housing developments. The provision of fantastic facilities, coaching and community engagement has led to locals embracing these rugby clubs, creating a relationship beneficial to both parties, Glasgow Hutchesons' Aloysians RFC are a fantastic example of this.

Having kept a close eye on the objections towards the development, I can't help but feel there is an element of "not in my back yard" selfishness to many of the complaints, especially with the headline statement of "save our park". For me, the park is there for the whole of the community to use not just those living adjacent to it. If the land could be re-purposed to benefit not just a growing club with several hundred members, but other organisations and the community as a whole, it would be a fantastic asset for Stonehaven.

As a sport rugby has been overlooked for many years but over the last decade its popularity has seen a meteoric rise and throughout that period Mackie RFC have been at the forefront of developing the sport in the North East. Most of the playable surfaces within the town are used by other sports such as football and cricket which is fantastic, but this has left the rugby club with very few options for training facilities or developing the club to match the quality of its training infrastructure and status within the youth game.

With players ranging from 3-63 the club has created an open-door community within the community and its continual growth shows the importance of the club to those living in the area. 
Good morning,

I am writing to you in support of the proposed Asset Transfer of land at Forest Park Stonehaven to Mackie Rugby Football Club. As a resident of Stonehaven for many years I have seen the hugely positive impact that this club has had on the entire community and in particular promoting health and wellbeing in children, not just from Stonehaven but across Aberdeenshire. My 2 children have been a part of the rugby community since they were 5 years old and it has not only ensured that they have good physical fitness but improved their mental health and also taught them how to respect other people. A club such as this that impacts so many children and adults should be given every bit of support we can to ensure they can keep doing such good work.

The situation as it stands now with regards to future training facilities, if not resolved, could result in the club having to close down and this would be absolutely devastating. I have bulleted a number of areas that I believe should be taken into consideration:

- Mackie RFC has just been promoted in the SRU league which shows just how much all the hard work of the players and coaches (at both youth and adult level) has paid off. We need to ensure that our facilities keep up with this growth so that we can continue to support potential future players (in particular given some of our youth players are being selected for the National youth team).
- Ilive close to the park in question and regularly walk my dog along the path next to the pavement. In all this time I have never seen anyone actually playing in the field area itself. Occasionally I may see the odd dog owner walking across it or on the same path as myself. The independent survey undertaken noted it had been used by 21 persons (not even different people) in a 2 week period. If the Asset Transfer goes ahead this will ensure the park is used by hundreds of people on a weekly basis (mostly children). I have noted that there are often families using the playpark but this is not going to be affected by the proposal, and in fact perhaps there is an opportunity as part of the proposal for it to get a refresh as a goodwill gesture.
- The club has attempted to purchase other areas of land within the Stonehaven area but is constantly being outbid by developers, so there are no alternative options at this time.
- Inotice that there is a petition in place for people protesting the Asset Transfer, but given that I have never seen anyone use the playing field (as backed up by the independent survey) I would question how many people on the petition have actually set foot in the park! I understand they went door to door asking residents to sign it without actually confirming if it was a space they use.
- Inote there were concerns about the floodlighting disturbing residents, however this is only going to be used during the darker winter months and rugby training does not take place late at night.
- The benefit that this club brings to hundreds of children across Aberdeenshire surely outweighs the protests of a few individuals who have many alternative walking routes....Mineralwell Park, Dunnottar Woods, Carronhill, etc.
- The SRU put in place a Development Officer, who is doing an amazing job at promoting the use of rugby in primary and secondary schools for both physical and mental wellbeing from Portlethen down to Laurencekirk. If the club has to fold because it has nowhere to train, this appointment will be lost and all the great work that is being done will be gone.
- If this does not go ahead and no other alternative land can be found (to please the minority of residents who occasionally walk across the playing field from time to time), where are our children to go? Who will tell them that they can't play rugby anymore?

In summary, for this Asset Transfer not to go ahead would be an absolute travesty! We should be supporting clubs such to become bigger and better, throwing our weight behind them so as to positively impact as many lives as possible instead of impeding them so the sake of a few individuals who don't like change. We have an opportunity to create a lasting legacy in our town that could continue for decades to come.

Even the park now when it has been raining is a nightmare to walk through.

When I moved to Aberdeen for university I still travelled through to train at Forest park twice a week via the train and having the train station so close to the training grounds was a massive bonus for myself and allowed me to continue supporting a club I loved playing for. This is why I think Forest Park is the ideal situation, due to the proximity of the train station.



As a resident of , Ifully support Mackie Rugby Club in their bit to purchase the park. As my property backs directly on to the park, Irecognise that it is not currently well used at all, despite what the recent publicity drive might try and have you believe. Along with other residents, I do sometimes walk around the outskirts of the park for exercise but my understanding from looking at the plans for the rugby, is there would still be paths in place to allow this to continue.

I'm aware that some people are worried they'll have nowhere close to exercise their dogs, however I would point out there is ample green space to exercise dogs on the opposite side of the road. I'm also convinced that dogs should not be allowed to run free and defecate on areas supposedly set aside for outdoor sport. I'm sure there used to be signs to this effect around the park when we first moved in more than 24 years ago, and that the council's animal welfare officer has received many complaints over the years about dog fouling in the park.

I can remember when the rugby club used to use the park before for matches and for training, and use the floodlights occasionally at night, and not once did the lights ever prevent my children from sleeping, and neither did the lights at the Hamish playpark even though these were much closer to our properties on

The rugby club currently has very nearly 400 children playing and/or training with them every week making it by far the largest youth sports club in Stonehaven, not to mention the provision for men and women of all ages and abilities to be and stay active. A sports facility with changing rooms and clubhouse at this end of the town could provide a tremendous alternative space for other clubs and groups to use at a time when it's proving harder and harder to book space either at the leisure centre, Mineralwell or the pavilion.

It is my understanding the rugby club has tried over many years to find an alternative home both through the council and as part of ongoing developments being granted around Stonehaven and have been thwarted for various reasons every time. It seems to me the rugby club should be applauded for their efforts and encouraged in their plans for the future and unless the council has an alternative option available should proceed with the asset transfer request.

I wish to register my support for the Proposed Asset Transfer of Land at Forest Park Stonehaven to Mackie Academy FP Rugby Club.

The Rugby Club finds itself in the increasingly difficult position if approaching the end it's lease at it's current location and limited suitable sites locally. The Club has been proactive in addressing this predicament with the assistance of Aberdeenshire Council Officers to identify suitable sites.

The land at Forest Park (Glenforest Park), which I note in the Ssettlement Summary - Open Spac Audit is designated as SPORTS AREA, is one of the very few areas of suitable size in or around Stonehaven.

MAFPRFC were offered the site for pitches back in the 1980's but were unable to proceed with the development after the SRU, their main financiers, discovered that the ground had been used effectively as a landfill site for building waste from the nearby building sites, namely Forest View Centre; Mill o' Forest Primary School Carronhill Special School and Forest Park and resulted in a totally inadequate depth of topsoil for sporting activity. I believe the Rugby Club has addressed this in their current plans.

I work at a site adjacent to the proposed development, in fact, my department windows directly overlook the ground. This has enabled me to conduct a personal survey of use of the area. I have been conducting my survey since early September when I was invited to view the Rugby Club's plans.

I have been thoroughly surprised by how little the area is, in actual fact, utilised -- i can be present on weekdays from 09.00 hrs to 14.45 hrs and have kept track of the number of dog walkers (and dogs), people actually using the grassed areas and the numbers using the trim track around the perimeter of the field. The most dog walkers in a single day has been 19 (23 dogs) most days there are around 12 - 14 owners exercising their pets. There are merely a handful of people who use the trimtrack (the School Crossing Patrol person most days - as a shortcut to his designated crossing, a handful of parents collecting their children from nursery and a few "grandparents walking their grandchildren" to or from the play park. Other than dog walkers there have only been a total of 4 people use the grassed area on all of the days i have compiled my survey. Since the beginning of November there has been a minimal increase in the numbers using the land - 2 new joggers, a cyclist using the trim track and a couple of people using the track as a shortcut to Forest Park.

This information proves to me that the Asset Transfer to the Rugby Club makes absolute sense - their subsequent development will enable hundreds of people to utilise the site while also enhancing sporting facilities in Stonehaven.

I view the Proposed Asset Transfer a "win win" situation for all and implore the Councillors to proceed.
