
















Materials and Finishes

Form and Materials

The building will stand alone without immediate neighbours from which to take any contextual precedent, which offers the opportunity to explore materiality and form through a wider lens, taking into account both the immediate grassy slope of the site, and the wider context of the North East of Scotland. The material palette and building profile hints at the existing Scotlish vernacular, whilst embracing contemporary material development and accommodating cutting edge facilities.

Conceptually, the base reflects an element of vernacular building from the North-East of Scotland, referencing the dry stone walls and dykes, and stone crofting cottages of the highlands. The heavy, grounded presence of the ground floor of the Seedpod will be accentuated with the use of external masonry or concrete. Formed around a central co-working space and external courtyard, the traditional Scottish steading form is also referenced.
