As the local MSP for Angus North and Mearns, I am delighted to write a letter in support of the Mill of Benholm Enterprise's application for the Community Asset Transfer of the Mill of Benholm site.

The Mill of Benholm is an A-listed 18th century rural water mill complex that used to mill oats. It has been described by Historic Environment Scotland as "an exceptional and rare survival". Following its renovation in 1996, the Mill of Benholm became a popular tourist attraction as people travelled from far and wide to witness one of Scotland's few remaining functional water-powered meal mills in action. However, in 2014 it was closed due to health and safety issues, and has remained shut since then. Its closure was a significant blow to the local community, as the site had become an important hub for community activities. The Mill of Benholm is owned by Aberdeenshire Council and since its closure the site has been mothballed, which has resulted in the Mill becoming inoperable due to damage to the water structure and harm caused by woodworm.

Since it was founded in 2017, the Mill of Benholm Enterprise has worked hard to develop a detailed plan to re-open the Mill of Benholm, halt any further deterioration, make the site accessible for the local community and visitors, and to preserve the Mill of Benholm for future generations. This Community Asset Transfer will help to open a new chapter in the



Mill's future, whilst also providing a boost to the local economy as tourists will return to Benholm to witness the historic Mill turn once again.







I have lived in Benholm for almost 16 years, which includes a number of years when Benholm Mill was still open. At the time, my children were very young and we visited it frequently for them to learn about the local wildlife, the purpose of such a mill and the importance of adults with extra needs having a place to work in both the café and the surrounding land.

We saw the building of the "donkey path", the introduction of better fruit and vegetable growing, Allyson's memorial garden, the opening of the shop and we attended various open days (Halloween treasure hunt, a demonstration of the wheel in action, and a woodwork demonstration).

The re-opening of Benholm Mill would allow many other families to enjoy these same educational experiences that my children did. I also see numerous walking groups out enjoying the coastal path between Inverbervie and Johnshaven and visiting the church in Benholm. JOINT STATEMENT BY HISTORIC CHURCHES SCOTLAND AND MILL OF BENHOLM ENTERPRISE

Historic Churches Scotland and Mill of Benholm Enterprise undertake to work together in partnership to further the preservation and promotion of Benholm Kirk and the Mill of Benholm: two Category A listed historic buildings of national importance. Our organisations will also work together to promote and enhance the built and natural environment of Benholm and the surrounding area for the benefit of the community, visitors, and the nation.

We recognise that Benholm Kirk and the Mill of Benholm are highly significant in their own right, and are also part of a grouping of buildings forming the Benholm Conservation Area. The hamlet of Benholm is an important survival of a historic farming community with its manse, smiddy, schoolhouse, cottages, mill, kirk and graveyard, which embodies a past rural way of life. Historic Churches Scotland and Mill of Benholm Enterprise also recognise the importance of the natural environment surrounding the hamlet, with its ancient woodland, open farmland, and picturesque burns. This natural environment is itself of significance and includes a number of designated sites.

Historic Churches Scotland and Mill of Benholm Enterprise undertake to collaborate in a variety of ways including holding joint events and exhibitions, volunteering, funding applications, and in the sharing of facilities. We want our work together to benefit both people and place.

Historic Churches Scotland and Mill of Benholm Enterprise share the aims of safeguarding built and natural heritage, supporting and growing the local economy, and of contributing to people's health and wellbeing. Through our joint working we plan to physically reconnect Benholm Kirk and Mill of Benholm through reinstating the woodland paths which once linked the two sites, allowing people to enjoy and learn from the historic buildings and the walk between them. Together we will explore opportunities to partner with others and to develop a network of local paths including the potential to connect to other established routes such as the Coastal Path.

We recognise that as a local and a national charity respectively, each organisation brings to our partnership particular skills, knowledge, and expertise. By combining our efforts and working together we believe we can achieve more for the Benholm community and the wider area.
